# A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR: AMY GRANT-QUONCE

Teen dating violence is an issue facing young adults all across our country. Each February, advocates, parents, and teens raise awareness about this very serious issue. This annual effort focuses on education and advocacy to stop dating abuse before it starts.

The prevalence of teen dating violence is staggering. Statistics show that 1 in 3 U.S. teens will experience physical, sexual, or emotional abuse from someone they're in a relationship with before becoming adults. And nearly half (43%) of U.S. college women report experiencing violent or abusive dating behaviors.

Warning signs of unhealthy relationships include extreme jealousy, temper outbursts, controlling behavior, pressure to have sex, and any kind of physical harm.

The 2025 theme for Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month is **Respect**That. Respecting someone isn't just a vague idea; it's action and a mindset.

The theme "Respect That" highlights the importance of treating partners with dignity, listening to their viewpoints, respecting their boundaries, and valuing their autonomy by focusing on "respect" (www.loveisrespect.org). If you have a teen in your life, I encourage you to speak openly with them about their relationships. Remember to stay non-judgmental and supportive.
